This term has been a very busy one for DET audits and follow up sessions.

In March the school went through an OH&S audit. The report was sent to the school and this term we are addressing the items listed for updating. We have completed many of them already.

On Monday May 20th, Theo Apostolides from MARSH visited & we were able to significantly complete our compliance checklist. We will be revisited in June and again in September to see how we are progressing on the recommendations.

<u>Finance Audit</u>—On Friday May 17th we were audited and found to be compliant in all but a few items. These will be presented at School Council and form part of the Finance Committee agenda each month.

Bus Audit. Another audit in the same week! Two representatives from Transport Vic visited and reviewed our school's bus policies and practices. One outcome was the advice that we do NOT need to have drivers with Taxi Accreditation. If the school is a registered bus provide then that is sufficient. I wish they'd told me before I renewed my accreditation! We also have done 'overkill' on the paperwork. Only two recommendations were listed.

Buster has passed the annual inspection and is cleared for take-off!

We received a lovely compliment last week. A visitor to the school made comment that the children here are very happy and relaxed. At ease. This is in contrast to the bigger schools this person visits frequently in their line of work.

Another testament to the environment in which you all choose to raise your children.!
